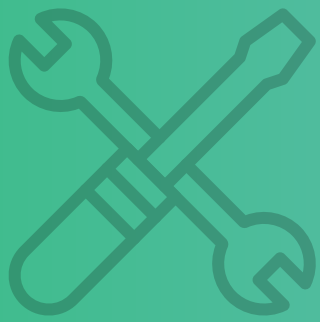
SOCIAL SKILLS GALORE

While engineers are problem-solvers, they're not on-call tech support for household issues. Their skills go far beyond fixing your Wi-Fi.

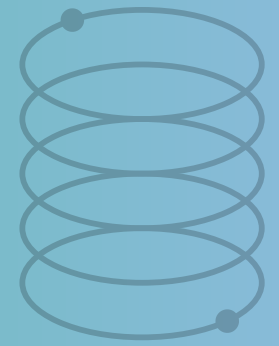

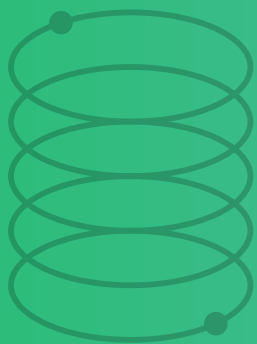
FAR FROM BORING

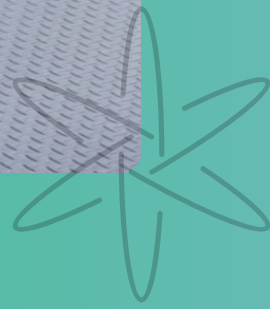


Not all engineers love math, but they appreciate it as a tool that enables their work.



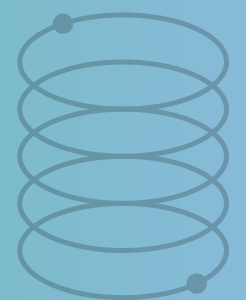


Engineers often excel in communication, working in teams, attending conferences, and brainstorming innovative ideas.

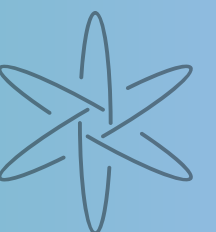


Being an engineer doesn't mean having a one-track mind. Many have varied hobbies and passions outside their work.

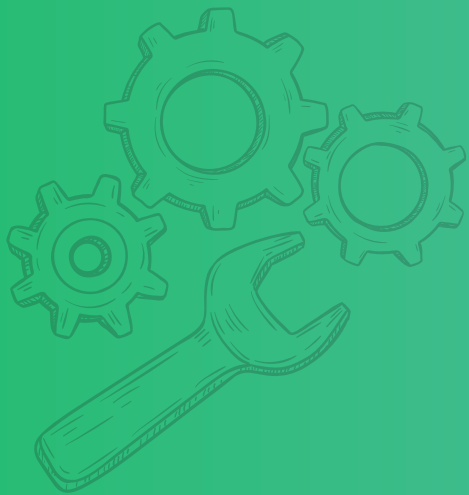
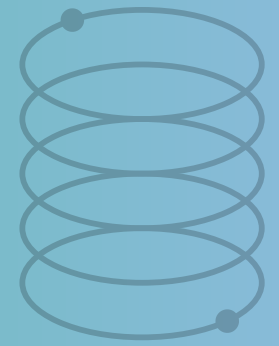
